- Crossing with other European Projects -

 Ileana Tache, the project coordinator, was invited by West Pomeranian University of Technology Szczecin, Poland, to deliver a cycle of lectures for the Erasmus students in the summer semester 2017/2018 (7.05 – 20.05.2018): History of European Integration and European Economic Policies.

This was an excellent opportunity for presenting the Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence of Transilvania University of Brasov in discussions with the dean of the Faculty of Economics, professor Bartosz Mickiewicz, the Erasmus coordinator professor Agnieszka Brelik and the Head of Marketing Department, professor Joanna Hernik.

The Erasmus students were informed about the Summer School that our Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence will organize in the period 25-30.08.2018.

 Based on the networking realized in ICABE Conference Sofia, September 2017, with other South Eastern European Universities, Nicolae Marinescu, the Erasmus coordinator of the Faculty of Economic Sciences and Business Administration and member of the research team of the Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence, made an Erasmus Plus Agreement with University of Malta. University of Malta was also a partner of Transilvania University of Brasov in a Horizon 2020 project application.

- The Call for the Summer School *The Eastern Enlargement: Opportunities and Chances for the New Member States* was posted on the project website. Expecting a great number of participants, the Summer School will take place in the period 25-30.08.2018 and the students are invited to produce essays on the topic of Eastern Enlargement which will be published in a volume issued by Transilvania University Publishing House.
