The Council room of Brasov City Hall hosted a public debate on security in Southeastern Europe. The debate was addressed to city representatives, professors, students and Ph.D. candidates of Transilvania University of Brasov, representatives of political parties, NGOs and media representatives.

The debate was attended by the following guests: Professor Ileana Tache - Ad Personam Jean Monnet Chair, Project Coordinator, Aurelian Danu - PNL county councilor, Ph.D. candidate at the Lucian Blaga University in Sibiu, Dragos David - director of Brasov

Discussions were focused on the topic of regional security, addressed generally, with reference both to the military security of Europe and the aspects of external and regional security, or even on particular issues, e.g. food security. The participants' interventions led to outlining the main challenges facing the European Union on the security, especially in the enlargement context and recent events concerning migration. 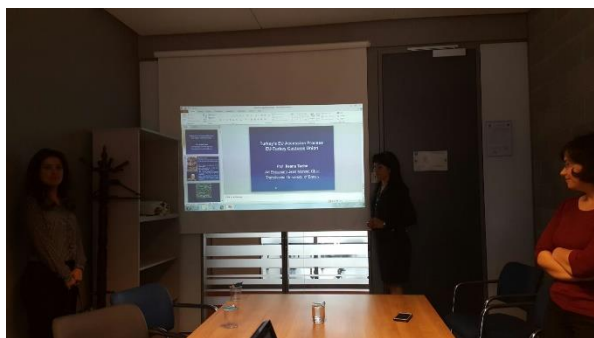
